The Tecolote and Bloomingdale are common ranunculus strains. The most popular is the Tecolote, with their large, five-inch petticote layers in bright colors.

artichokes



Nearly 100% of all artichokes grown commercially in the United States are grown in California, with 80% coming from Monterey County.

Called English peas to differentiate them from snow peas or sugar snap peas, they are around only in the cool part of the spring.
