dahlias



The official flower of Seattle hails from Mexico. There are over 30 species and 20,000 types, ranging from dinner-plate size to singularly petite blooms.

apricots



Look for fruit that is slightly soft and has deep, orange skin (pale/yellow is no bueno) — both are signs of tree-ripened perfection.

kelsey plums



Heart-shaped and sweet, these late season plums are bright green beauties that ripen to yellow with flecks of red.
